


Yosemite National Park

A Yosemite is a national park in the Sierra Nevada Mountains of Northern California, known for its massive granite cliffs, waterfalls, and spectacular views. As the third most popular National Park in the country, it receives over five million visitors per year.

How was Yosemite National Park Created

Yosemite was officially made into a National Park on October 1, 1890, but many different people and events were necessary to get Yosemite on the map.

185

The Mariposa Battalion, a California militia group, first called the area Yosemite, named after a tribe of Native American.

1864

President Abraham Lincoln signed the Yosemite Grant, putting the land under the protection of the State of California

1890

Yosemite became the third official National Park in America, following Yellowstone and Mackinac.

1903

John Muir took President Theodore Roosevelt on a camping trip to Yosemite Valley. John Muir was a nationalist and professional explorer. His writing and journals helped to get Yosemite officially designated as a national park and continue to inspire people today.

1906

Yosemite expanded to include the land that was formerly under the control of the state of California from the Yosemite Grant. This included many of the most popular sites in the park today such as Yosemite Valley and the Mariposa Grove.

1916

The National Park Service was created to protect and maintain the National Parks.

National parks are chosen for their natural beauty, unique geological features, and unusual ecosystems. Yosemite is 1169 square miles of mountains, cliffs, waterfalls, forests, valleys, lakes, rivers and more.

Things to do

Hiking, Photography, Biking, Camping, Swimming, Rock Climbing, Kayaking, Horseback Riding, Snowshoeing, and Ice fishing.

Wildlife

Black Bears, big horned sheep, coyotes, bobcats, mule deer, and over 400 more species of animals live in the park.






